Conference on “The ICJ in the Service of Peace and Justice”

Monday 23 September 2013

Live and on-demand streaming

THE HAGUE, 19 September 2013. As announced in Press Release 2013/19, the International Court of Justice (ICJ), the principal judicial organ of the United Nations, has decided to provide video coverage of the conference entitled “The ICJ in the Service of Peace and Justice”, which will be held on Monday 23 September 2013 at the Peace Palace, seat of the Court.

The conference will begin at 9.30 a.m. (The Hague Local Time/GMT +2) and will finish at 6 p.m. The conference will be streamed live and on-demand via the Internet (low resolution web streaming) for the general public and in H264 high definition streaming for the world’s televised media.

Live web streaming for the general public

The conference will be streamed live on the following two channels:

1. the Court’s website (multimedia gallery); and
2. the United Nations on-line television channel (webtv.un.org/), under the heading “Live Now”.

This e-broadcast service for the general public will be available in English and French, on both desktops and mobile devices.

Live streaming for the use of the televised media (H264, 1080p)

The images produced by the Court will, for the first time, be made directly available to the televised media by means of a high definition streaming service (H264, 1080p) introduced in co-operation with the Television Section (UNTV) of the United Nations Department of Public Information (UNDPI). Images of the conference (16/9 ratio) will be available in H264 high definition format (1080p, Full HD) in English and French. Media wishing to obtain these images are requested to send an e-mail to tech@streamworksint.com no later than noon (GMT) on Friday 20 September 2013. A UNDP/Streamworks technician will provide assistance in establishing and testing the necessary connection.

On-demand and recorded streaming

Images of the conference will be available on the following channels:

1. the Court's website (multimedia gallery) from 24 September onwards;
2. the United Nations on-line television channel (webtv.un.org/), under the heading "Meeting & Events/ICJ";
3. UNTV, the United Nations cable television channel (channel 150), available on the Time Warner Cable network at United Nations Headquarters and throughout the New York metropolitan area, according to a schedule to be established at a later date; and
4. the United Nations Audiovisual Library of International Law (www.un.org/law/avl) under the heading "Lecture Series" (the files will be uploaded to the website after the conference).

Programme and conference proceedings

The full proceedings of the conference will be published on-line later this month, without translation. The proceedings will be published by the Registry at a later date in two separate language versions (English and French), as soon as the relevant translations have been prepared.
