The following information from the Registry of the International Court of Justice has been communicated to the Press :

The International Court of Justice to-day (Wednesday, September 26th, 1951) held two sittings, during the course of which the oral proceedings in the Fisheries case (United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland v. Norway) were continued.

Sir Eric Beckett, Agent for the United Kingdom, continued his argument in support of the British case. He interrupted his address while Commander Kennedy, late of the Royal Navy, at his request, explained, with the aid of diagrams displayed in Court, the methods followed by ships' captains to discover the position of their craft in order to ensure that they were not within territorial waters. Sir Eric Beckett will continue his speech to-morrow (Thursday, September 27th) at the public hearing beginning at 10.30 a.m.
